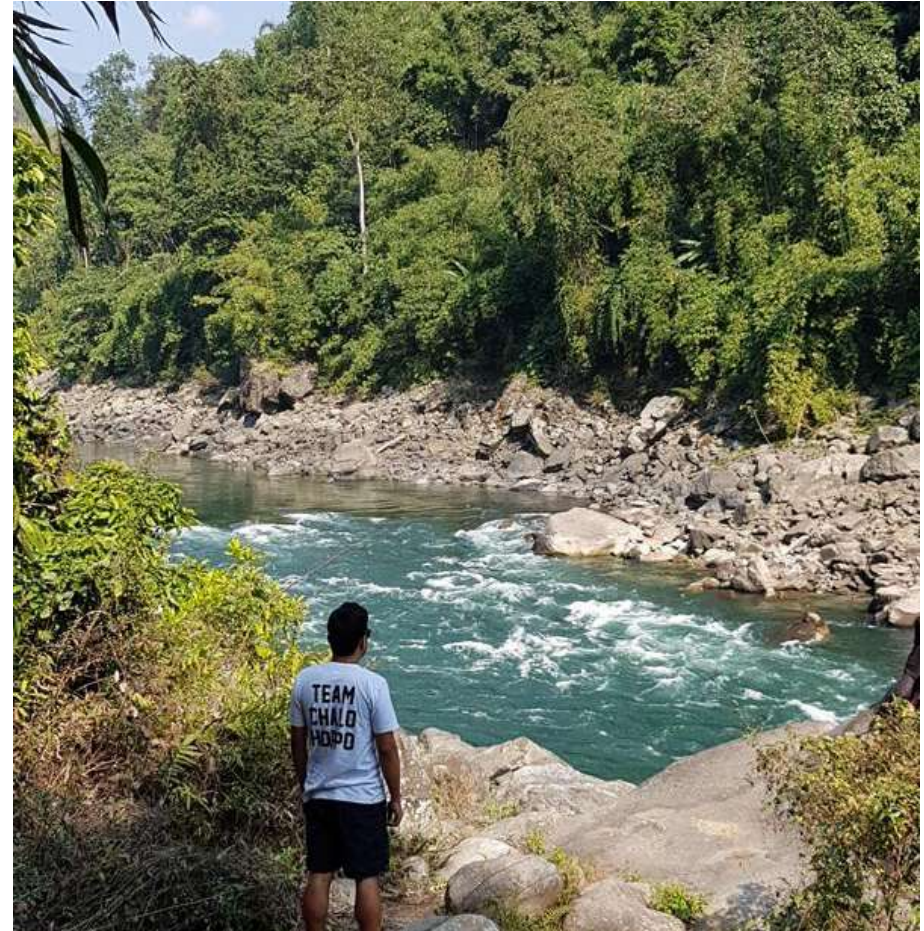
# The brief Itinerary

3 nights and 2 days



## Day 1 A drive from Guwahati

Start your drive from Guwahati at noon and reach our campsite by evening. Enjoy a night of camping by the river with a bonfire and music for company. Enjoy Dinner and get to know your guide as he briefs you on the next day's plan.



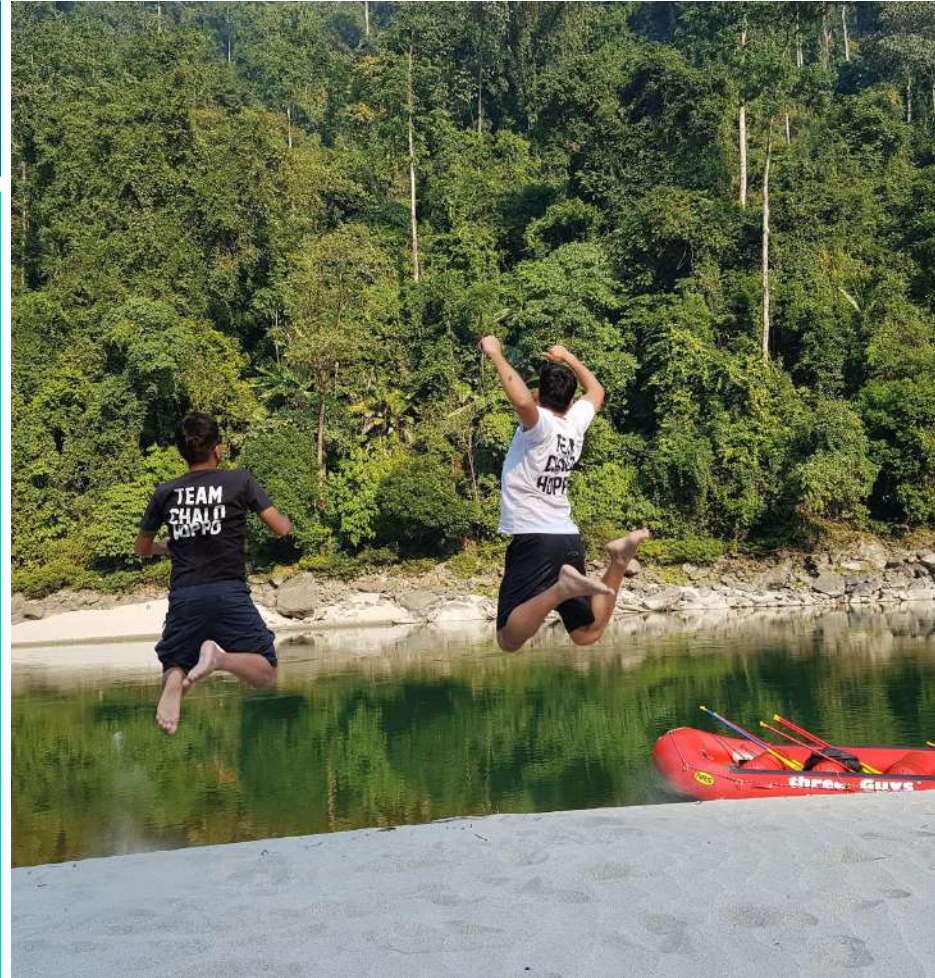


## Day 2 A day to raft, swim and do much more

Post Tea and breakfast, we make our way to the rafts where the guides will give you a simple orientation on the basics of rafting.

A typical day will include rafting for a few hours at a time, stopping for scenic side-canyon hikes, and possible swimming/cliff jumping opportunities. Make your way to the camp, have lunch and take a dip in the natural swimming pools nearby with crystal clear water.

Visit one of the largest Orchid Research Center Of Asia in the early evening, before returning to camp for another fun evening.





## Day 3 Trek to Pakke Tiger Reserve

Post breakfast, start your trek to the Pakke Tiger Reserve. Cross the river with the raft and then trek in the jungle with the forest guards & our guides.

Watching the elephants graze on the opposite bank (equipped with binoculars) is not uncommon. Herds of gaur can be seen by the water. Deer, Sambar and Wild boar are at large through the day. Our resident Leopard has also been spotted by guests numerous times this year and if really lucky you may even find the elusive Sher Khan walking the banks of the backwaters.

After about 2 hours trek, transfer back to the campsite.

Post lunch depart back to Guwahati and we conclude the fun-filled day of adventure trip.

- Cost incidental to any change in the itinerary/ stay on account of flight cancellation due to bad weather, ill health, roadblocks and/or any factors beyond control.
- Anything not specifically mentioned under the head "Inclusions".

# FAQ's

**Q. Where does the trip start from?**

A: The trip starts from Guwahati Railway Station at Noon on Day 1.

**Q. How many people are required for the trip?**

A: A minimum of 4 people is required for the trip to happen. In case you sign up and we don't get 4 people, we will notify you about the same and giving you a full refund 72 hours before the trip.

**Q. Do I need a Visa, inner line permit or any other kind of identity proof to enter Northeast India?**

A: Entry to Arunachal Pradesh will require an inner line permit for domestic travellers. Foreigners visiting Arunachal Pradesh have to get a protected area permit or PAP.

**Q. I am a solo traveller, can I come on this trip?**

A: A most definite yes, as long as you are okay travelling in a mixed group of other solo travellers or small group of friends.



# FAQ's

**Q. I am a vegetarian, I hear that people only consume meat there. How will I manage?**

A: Though vegetarians may not have the luxury of tasting all the local foods as these are mostly meat-based. You have nothing to worry you will get all kinds of basic sabji, dal, rice, roti, papad, salad etc. Your cravings for butter paneer or mushroom Manchurian may not be fully satisfied but you will do just fine. You must ensure that you are trying out all the available seasonal fruits and local wild leaves.

**Q. Can I book extra nights of hotel accommodation before or after my tour?**

A: Extra nights can be booked based on availability. You can also visit our [Custom trip section](#) to plan a different trip.

# FAQ's

**Q. Is it safe to travel to Northeast India? I have been warned about Naxalites, ULFA and other terrorist groups.**

A: The sources of such warnings should be checked and speaking from the perspective of locals living in the region we can say that though some parts of Northeast India do have cases of groups clashing against government forces from time to time, it doesn't affect a tourist as long as the route is chosen wisely and hours of commute are decided smartly, much like travelling in any other part of the world.

If you have seen warnings in the advisory pages of governments, then we would like to remind you that governments (of different countries) will always take precaution and not be in sync with the real situation. Northeast India is absolutely safe with warm and welcoming locals. You should have no issues even going to the most interior places. As with any other tribal dominated region, respect the local culture and don't hurt their sentiments, and you will have a great time in a beautiful place.

Because so less is known about the region in general, it may be a wise idea to get in touch with some travel experts before you plan your trip.
